**Nunavut**  
Residents returning from outside of the territory for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; exception for residents returning directly from Northwest Territories or Churchill, Manitoba

III Intra-Territorial 2.5

**Northwest Territories**  
Residents returning from outside of the territory for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Territorial 0.0

**Yukon**  
Residents returning from outside of the territory for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 9.5

**British Columbia**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel

II Hyper Local 71.3

**Alberta**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province; international travellers returning to AB at select borders may be eligible to engage in a pilot to quarantine for less time (approx. 48 hours)

II Hyper Local 159.6

**Saskatchewan**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel.

II Hyper Local 107.7

**Manitoba**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days, exception for residents returning directly from western Canada or northwestern Ontario

II Hyper Local 71.1

**Ontario**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel are requested to self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 132.7

**Quebec**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel

II Hyper Local 205.8

**Newfoundland and Labrador**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 0.6

**Prince Edward Island**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 1.3

**Nova Scotia**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; exception for residents returning directly from other Atlantic provinces

II Hyper Local 3.7

**New Brunswick**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days
